UMAP 25th Anniversary (Toyo University, 2016)

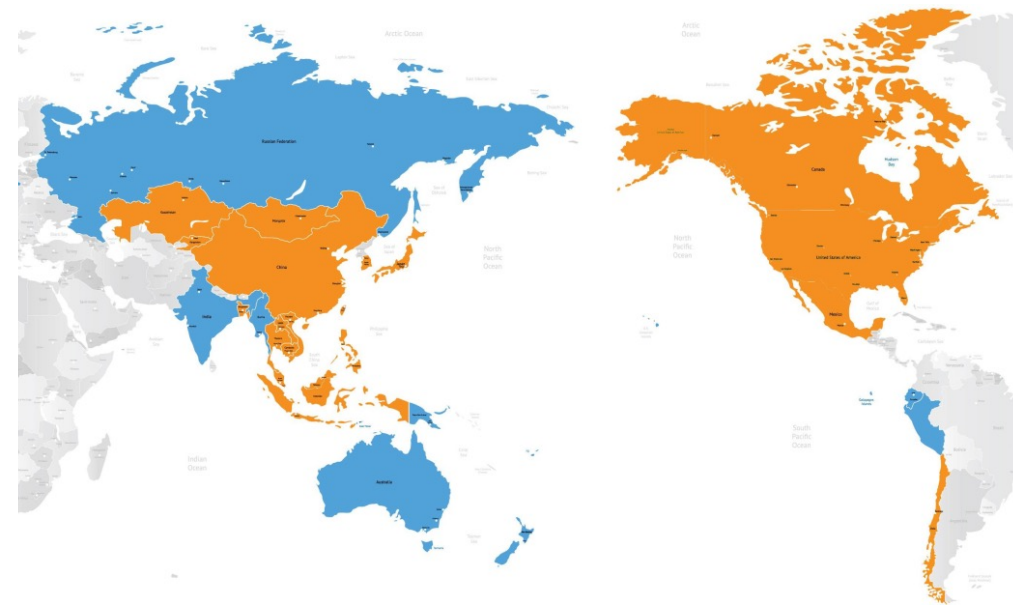


Toyo University served as the International Secretariat of UMAP (2016-2020)

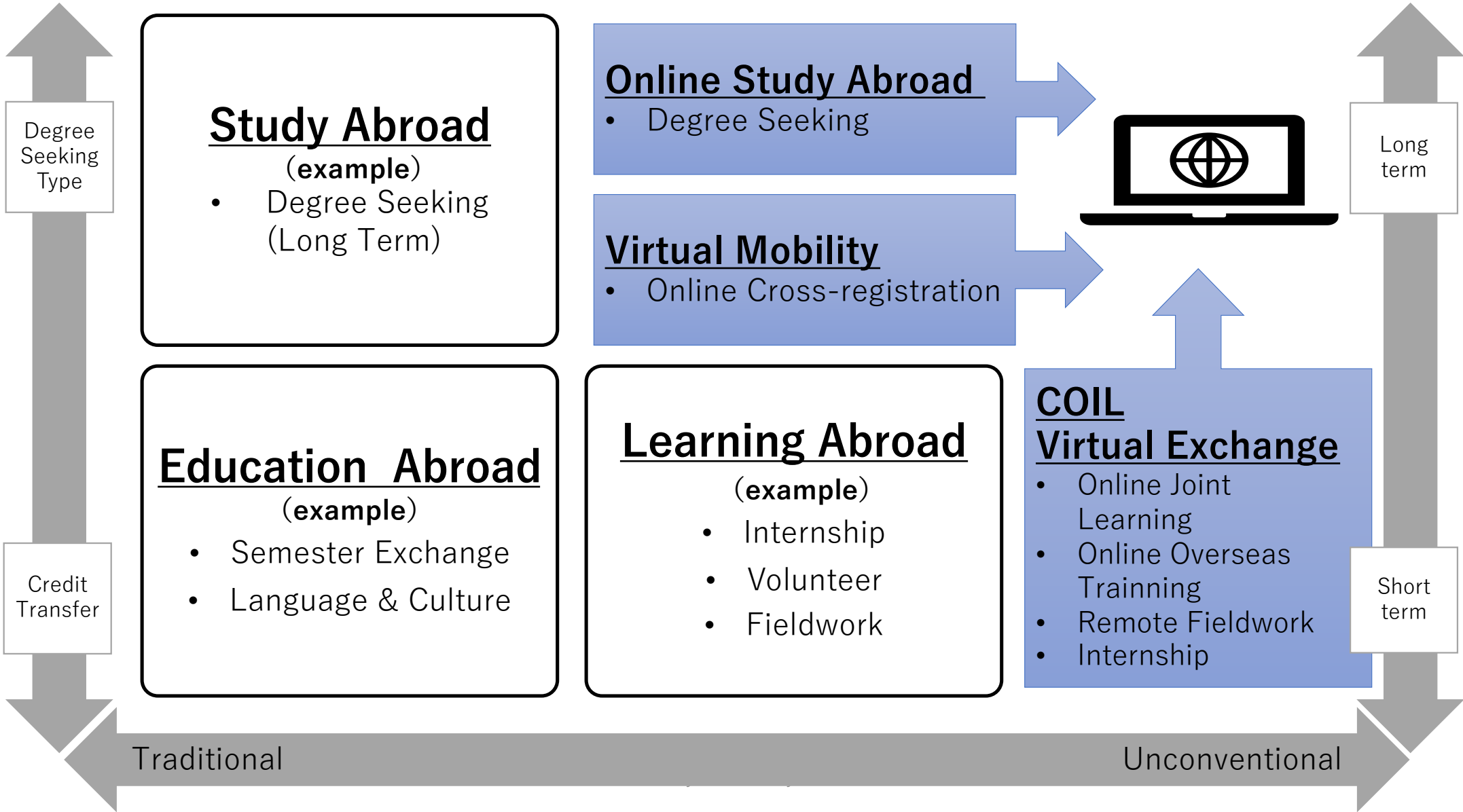

3. Create a consortia or using existing consortia (such as UMAP)

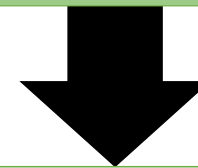
