Three Amazing Professors Retire

After more than 100 years of teaching excellence, three very distinguished professors will be retiring from the NSOC this May. Doctors Bob Davis, Fred Fedler and Tom Morgan, who joined the university when it was Florida Technological University, were essential to the development of the advertising/public relations, journalism and radio/television programs. Decades later the Nicholson School has grown to produce thousands of successful graduates in Central Florida and around the world.

As a final salute and heartfelt farewell, UCF alumni, students and faculty gathered on Wednesday, April 9 at the FAIRWINDS Alumni Center. The Swinging '70s celebration transported party-goers back in time to an era of tie-die, go-go boots and peace and love – when Davis, Fedler and Morgan first joined the university.

Dr. Bob Davis is the division head for the advertising/public relations division and was essential in developing the program into what it is today. He taught his first class at UCF in 1977.

Best in State

In an awards luncheon on Saturday, April 5th, UCF Knightly News was named "Best College TV Newscast for 2007" by the Florida Associated Press for a show it produced in spring 2007. "It is quite an honor to our program and our students," said Professor George Bagley.

"UCF Knightly News is a weekly, 30-minute television news show produced completely by students in the RTV Broadcast Journalism Track with studio production support from students in the Production track. The show was judged on its journalistic content and organization. The show airs live each Friday during the term at 2:00 p.m. and airs tape-delay on the UCF Channel at various times throughout the week, as well as on Brighthouse Cable systems in the metropolitan Orlando area each Tuesday evening at 9:00 p.m. It is produced in the RTV studio.

Also, Broadcast Journalism student, Diana Bosch, won second place for "Best Long Light Radio News Feature," and was one of two Florida Broadcast Journalism students to win a \$500 Associated Press scholarship.

Davis earned his Ph.D. in mass communications from Ohio State University in 1975 with his professional accreditation from both the Florida Public Relations Association and the International Association of Business Communicators. In 1992, he earned certification from FPRA. His resume includes ad agency experience and ownership as well as work in corporate public relations for Ross Laboratories and R.G. Barry Corporation.

Dr. Fred Fedler began teaching at UCF in 1971 and is the iournalism division's senior faculty member, serving as head of the journalism division from 1982-1998 and again from 2004-present. After graduating from the University of Wisconsin, he worked as a reporter and copy editor for three newspapers in Iowa and California. Fedler then earned his master's degree at the University of Kentucky and his Ph.D. at the University of Minnesota. Since coming to UCF, he has written four books, including a reporting textbook used at hundreds of colleges and universities across the country.

Dr. Tom Morgan is a valued professor in the Ad/PR program responsible for organizing the radio/television courses at UCF in 1972. He has a wide variety of experience in the communication field that includes broadcasting, teaching, corporate, entrepreneurial enterprise, and politics (he was the Mayor of the City of Oviedo from 1979 -1981). Morgan has published dozens of articles and produced numerous copyrighted television programs, as well as giving more than a thousand professional presentations as a keynote or other speaker.

The entire NSOC wishes them well in their retirement; all three will be missed.

Dr. Milan "Meeske" Award Announced

The Interpersonal and Organizational Communication Division announces the endowment of The Milan Meeske Award for Outstanding Graduate Student at the Nicholson School of Communication. Dr. Milan "Mike" Meeske was Director of the Nicholson School of Communication from 1993 to 2003. Students in both the Mass Communication and Interpersonal tracks will be eligible. The winner will receive a \$500 stipend and his or her name will be added to a permanent plaque displayed at the Nicholson School of Communication. A faculty committee will consider and announce the award in the spring semester of each year beginning in spring 2009.

Four Inducted into Top Honors Society

UCF senior Journalism major Melissa Patterson was named Top Scholar among four students selected in April for 2008 membership in Kappa Tau Alpha, the nation's third-oldest academic honors society and the most exclusive in Communication. Joining her were Journalism majors Brandon Bielich, Stephanie de Sousa and Jessica Tuggle.

Students are selected for KTA from among print and broadcast journalism

majors with exceptional academic records. Only the top 10 percent of students who have met certain criteria for credit hours and GPA are eligible each year.

Journalism Majors Clean Up In SPJ MOE Competition

UCF students and alumni garnered 11 awards, including five first place prizes, at the Society of Professional Journalists regional Mark of Excellence luncheon March 29. Student chapter President, Melissa Patterson reported that the ceremony was "basically, a tribute to us."

Three prizes, plus possible honorable mention, were given in each category. The list of Journalism majors who won prizes:

The staff of the *Central Florida Future*, under the consecutive editorships of Aboraya and Heyboer in 2007, won third prize for Best All-Around Non-Daily Student Newspaper.

UCF student **Grant Lowther** won the first place prize for General Column Writing.

UCF tied the University of Georgia for most first place prizes in newspaper categories. UCF finished second in newspaper prizes overall to Georgia, which had 16. UCF was well ahead of the University of Florida, which earned three, but no first prizes.

Faculty News

Drs. Kimiko Akita and **George Musambira** were accepted to participate in the Diversity Track of the 2008 Summer Faculty Development Conference, UCF, which will be held in April 29-May 2, 2008.

Mr. George Bagley's article "A Presence in Time and Space: Authority and Meaning in the Reception Complex" has been accepted for publication in the Spring 2008 issue of "Kinema: Journal of Film and Audiovisual Media."

Dr. Rufus Barfield conducted workshops at the 2008 South Carolina Obesity Prevention Summit, presented by the Eat Smart Move More Coalition on March 6 and 7. The workshops included "Coalition Building" and "Evaluation and Coalition Development." The workshops focused on how to form community coalitions in pursuit of South Carolina Department of Health grant funding and on community health intervention in obesity.

In April, Dr. Barfield will attend the 2008 Scholarly Conference on College Sport "Issues in College Sport" symposium. He will serve as a panelist on Conducting the Business of College Sport "Well" trends and Issues in College Sport, sponsored by the University of Memphis and the College Sport Research Institute.

Dr. Kristin Davis attended the Southern States Communication Association's 78 Annual Convention in Savannah, GA on April 3-6. It was held at the Hyatt Regency in beautiful historic, downtown Savannah. This year's theme was "Communicating to Change the Human Condition." She was

invited to present on two spotlight panels: (1) Spotlight on Scholarship: Celebrating Scholars New to SSCA II; (2) The Job Search: Advice for Candidates and Employers from New Faculty.

Dr. Denise DeLorme has been awarded a nationally competitive research fellowship from the American Academy of Advertising for her co-authored proposal, "Prescription Drug Information-Seeking Behaviors and DTC Advertising Effects among Asian American Consumers."

DeLorme also received an Honorable Mention Award for Best Reviewers of 2007 on the Journal of Advertising Editorial Review Board.

Dr. Rick Kenney taught more than 100 of the nation's professional copy editors at the annual meeting of the American Copy Editors Society in Denver in early April. He led a session titled "All This and Ethics, Too? The Moral Imperative of Copy Editing" and moderated and presented in a session titled "Stop Plagiarism Before It Gets to Print." Kenney was recognized at the ACES banquet for his work as a Dow Jones Newspaper Fund residency director and as an alumnus of the fund's editing intern program – the only person to have achieved both distinctions.

Kenney's article "The Real Gender-Bender: The Curious Case of Coverage of the Steve Stanton Story" appears in the Spring 2008 issue of the *Florida Communication Journal*.

Dr. Harry Weger's manuscript that he co-authored with John Seiter, "The Effect of Generalized Compliments, Sex of Server, and Size of Dining Party on Tipping Behavior in Restaurants" has been accepted for publication in the Journal of Applied Social Psychology.

Dr. Jim Katt's grant title is "Big Three vs. Big Five: A side-by-side test of trait measures and their usefulness in identifying relationships between personality traits and communication variables."

Student Highlights

She spoke about longevity in Japan; the cultural offenses of Memoirs of Geisha; the wearing of kimono and performance of the traditional tea ceremony; about traditional and ancient Japanese koto (13-string floor harp) and shamisen (threestring guitar); how the soroban (abacus) can be used to calculate faster than calculator; how to create origami; and Japanese linedancing. World-famous koto musician Tomoko Kawahara appeared onstage and played traditional Japanese tunes as well as When You Wish Upon a Star, earning a standing ovation from about 330 LIFE members who attended the talks.

The NSOC Graduate Program would like to congratulate its top students for 2007. These students were honored at the Knight Images Awards Ceremony on Saturday, March 29, 2008.

Outstanding Graduate Student

Melissa Emmett received both an assistantship and the Provost Fellowship when she entered the program. The Provost Fellowship is the most prestigious fellowship awarded to master's students. She has been an outstanding student, teacher, and researcher over the past two years. Melissa co-authored two papers at the National Communication Association Conference in 2007. She is also first author on a co-authored article with Dr. Weger that is accepted for publication in the Journal of Social and Personal Relationships. Melissa also successfully defended her thesis this spring term. She graduates this semester with a 4.0 GPA, a rare accomplishment in the program. Melissa has been offered a top level graduate assistantship to attend Arizona State University's outstanding communication doctoral program.

Outstanding Graduate Teaching Associate

Jacey Brown completed the master's degree in Spring 2007. Because of her outstanding teaching in the speech fundamentals program, Jacey was hired as an adjunct faculty member to teach Business and Professional Communication, an upper-level course in the Interpersonal/Organizational Communication major. Jacey's student evaluations are among the highest among both GTA's and faculty who teach speech fundamentals. Jacey further demonstrated her commitment to the Nicholson School and to teaching by spearheading a service learning partnership between our Com 1000 class and the Junior Achievement organization. The project was recognized with \$2,500 grant through the Provost and the Winter Park Health Foundation.

Outstanding Master's Thesis

Melissa Shrader completed the master's degree in spring 2007. Her thesis, directed by Dr. Denise DeLorme, was titled "How College Age Women Perceive that Extensive Exposure to Beauty and Fashion Magazines Affects the Female Body Image." Her findings, which supported the theoretical rationale, were based on in-depth interviews with 17 female students, resulting in 135 pages of transcript to code and analyze. Melissa subsequently presented a paper on this research at the 2007 conference of the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication (AEJMC) in Washington D.C.
