





5-step towards academic writing

- Make notes in the Zettelkästen (Slip Box) System
- Develop your topics, questions, and research projects bottom up from within the system
- After a while, you will have developed ideas far enough to decide on a topic to write about.
- Turn your notes into a rough draft.
- Edit and proofread your manuscript.



Niklas Luhmann

- German sociologist & system theorist; famous for high academic productivity.
- 70+ books and nearly 400 scholarly articles published on a variety of subjects, including law, economy, politics, art, religion, ecology, mass media, and love.
- Luhmann was famous for his extensive use of the "slip box" or Zettelkästen note-taking method. His slip box has 90,000 index cards for his research, and he credited it for enabling his extraordinarily prolific writing.







Step 1: Make an entry of citation

- Record papers day by day
- Full citation needed
- Leave the space to write summary of the research in your own word when finishing the reading

Step 2: Read a paper and create literature notes

- When reading a paper, write down its contents in your own words in different notes
- One note one idea
- No need to directly copy quotes.
 Instead, use page number and keywords

Follow the step 2 and 3 to read other papers

- Organize notes from Step 2-4 into permanent notes, relating to your own research topic
 - Organize permanent notes in the slip box
 - File each one behind one or more related notes
 - Add links to related notes
- Make sure you will be able to find the note later
- Execute step 5 at the end of the day



Step 5: Write permanent notes

Luhmann's 90,000 cards were accumulated at the speed of 6 cards a day during his career.
