- The Member of Parliament (MP) of Muar (2018-)
- Minister of Youth and Sports (2018-)
- Youth Chief of the Malaysian United Indigenous Party (BERSATU) (2016-)
- Good debater (winners of the United Asian Debating Championship, 2015)
- Once worked for Mahathir for a year as his researcher

Shinjirō Koizumi, Japan

- Born in 1981 (Age 38)
- A member of the House of Representatives of the Liberal Democratic Party (2009-)
- The current Minister of the Environment (2019-)
- A son of 56th Japanese Prime Minister Junichirō Koizumi

 - ✓ The president and the vice president




- ✓ Members of the People's Representative Council (DPR)






Political career of the 2019 DPR members




Occupation of the 2019 DPR members




Local political elite among the 2019 DPR members




Age composition of DPR members






DPR members born in the 1980s: (2) Occupation



- Graduated from Clark University, 2004
- Director of PT Kertas Nusantara, owned by Prabowo
- Two-term DPR member (2017-)
- The 2014-2019 DPR Commission IV (Agriculture, Environment, Forestry, and Fishery)
- Around 60,000 followers of his Instagram
- Received 71,207 votes in the 2019 election

- Three-term DPR member since 2009
- The 2009-2019 DPR Commission IX (Health, Population, Labor, and Transmigration)
- Regularly visits districts for commission events
- Deputy chairman of Commission IX (May 2019-)
- Received 98,847 votes in the 2019 election

- Mother: Irna Natulita DPR 2009-2014 (PKS) Bupati Pandeglang, 2016-2021
- Sister: Rizka Amalia Natakusumah DPR candidate (Nasdem)
- Sister: Risya Azzahra Rahimah Natakusumah DPR candidate (Nasdem)
- Graduated from the University of Nottingham
- Received 56,123 votes in the election



DPR members born in the 1990s: Case (2) Slamet Ariyadi

- Born in Sampang on 30 September
 1990 (Age 29)
- Madura, East Java
- PAN
- Father: Farmer
- Graduated from Universitas Turnojoyo Madura, 2015
- Running a small business in Madura
- Local leader of Indonesian Islam Student Movement (PMII)
- Founder of Samang Youth Action, 2017
- Door-to-door canvassing campaign with his PMII friends
- Received 133,495 votes in the election

Conclusion

- Young entrepreneurs, children of political and business elite family, and those without elite family background nor enormous wealth in Indonesian Parliament today
- → The narrowing of the doors for non-elite citizens to directly participate in national politics
 - ✓ More and more business and local political elite, including their family members, enter the national political arena through the general election.
 - ✓ Political parties, particularly, non-Islamic parties have been used as political vehicles by political elite families.
- Two types of Indonesian young politician
 - ✓ Those who cultivate support using social media
 - ✓ Those who enhance grassroots support by going to the ground

Conclusion

- A young entrepreneur (Age 35), who is not a DPR member, was appointed as Minister of Education
- No young politician in PKS, the only opposition party in Indonesia today
